

Public Consultation Programme

The Public Consultation Programme is made up of a number of elements, designed to reach as wide an audience as possible and encourage them to make formal, written submissions to us on the Draft Dublin City Development Plan 2011-2017. These elements are;

Statutory Notice published in the national press.

Public displays where people can view the Draft Plan in their local area.

City Council Meetings where people can watch the Council debate the issues and engage in the statutory procedure of making the Development Plan.

Drop-In Information Days - here people can discuss the contents of the Draft Plan with Council staff one-to-one.

Sectoral/Representative Interest Group meetings, culminating in Dublin Debates, where specific networks and their members will be encouraged to discuss the Draft Plan and make submissions.

Joint Strategic Policy Committee meeting, where the policy groups of Dublin City Council will engage in discussion on the Draft Plan.

Web-consultation at www.dublincitydevelopmentplan.ie, which includes video, downloads, formal submission facility and on-line discussion thread where people can find out about the Plan, its contents and the process and make their views known.

Video/DVD – this sets out what the Draft Plan is, what it's for and how it's structured. It is available on the web-site and on DVD.
